

ROLE PROFILE REGIONAL DRESSAGE REPRESENTATIVE



The Role:

The Regional Dressage Representative is involved in the development and promotion of dressage within the region and works closely with the Regional and County Instructors to achieve this.

The Regional Dressage Representative plays a vital role in working with groups to support the delivery of sessions that are of a high quality, as well as offering advice to participants and volunteers interested in the discipline or wanting to know more about the routes to competition.

All representatives have the opportunity to contribute to the development of RDA Dressage at a national level, through participation in an annual meeting with the Dressage Committee.

Responsibilities:

- Ensuring groups are fully briefed on RDA UK guidelines, policies and procedures with reference to dressage
- Visiting groups to provide ongoing advice and support and to promote safe practices involving dressage
- Coordinating the organising of regional events related to dressage such as dressage qualifiers
- Working closely with the Regional Instructor and County Instructors as an authority on RDA dressage and offering support to ensure correct procedures are followed during competitions and at training days
- Signposting participants looking for dressage opportunities to suitable groups within the Region
- Attending one meeting per annum with the National Dressage Committee to report on dressage activities within the Region

Method of Appointment:

- Letter of recommendation from the Regional Chairman, along with an applicant CV, is sent to the Dressage Committee
- After consultation with the relevant Regional Chairman, the Regional Dressage Rep shall be appointed by the National Dressage Committee
